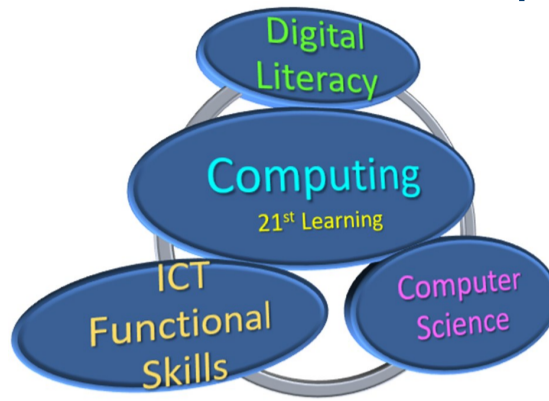


## The Digital transformation in Education
